RULES AND REGULATIONS:

1. Pre-novice and Novice level horses will be allowed to compete in English tack or western tack, snaffle or curb bits, 1 or 2 hands
2. GHS and SANEF rules apply
3. All riders and horses must be registered with with SANEF or GHS
4. Rider categories:
Child rider: Rider under 12 years
Junior rider: Rider over 12 but younger than 18
5. No martingales, whips, nosebands or tie downs will be allowed
6. Youth (under 18) must compete in a helmet
7. Youth will be allowed to ride in a snaffle or curb bit 1 or 2 hands
8. The organizers reserve the right to cancel, combine and restrict classes
9. Pre-novice classes the horses will not be expected to lope
10. Child rider pre-novice classes the pony may be on or off a lead line, and may be split at the discretion of the show organizer

DESCRIPTION OF CLASSES:

WESTERN PLEASURE: The riders all compete together in the ring, they must demonstrate a walk, jog and lope to the left and to the right. At the end of the class the riders are asked to rein back. The calm manner of the horse and quick reaction to the aids given by the rider during transitions are judged. Penalty points are given for riding too fast and for the wrong gait or lead.

WESTERN HORSEMANSHIP: Is a competition where the capabilities of the rider are judged. There are two parts to the class, the first part the rider must complete an individual course that has been given to them before the class and the second phase where the riders must compete together to show the walk, jog and lope. The judge pays attention to the seat of the rider, their confidence and the manner in which they communicate with their horse.

WESTERN TRAIL: This class is similar to the working riding class, though the obstacles are similar to those you would find out on the trail. There are 3 mandatory obstacles, opening closing a gate, a backing obstacle and walking, jogging and/or loping over a pole or series of poles. The horse is judged on the willingness to follow the riders cues and maneuver through the obstacles smoothly. The horse will be penalized for refusing, hitting poles, misbehavior etc

WESTERN REINING: This competition calls for the rider to demonstrate complete control of a horses every movement. The horse must complete a prescribed pattern (as in dressage) and the horse will be judged on neatness, maneuverability and obedience. Penalties are given for incorrect leads, breaking gait, resisting the riders cues etc. The rider will be disqualified if they fail to follow the correct pattern

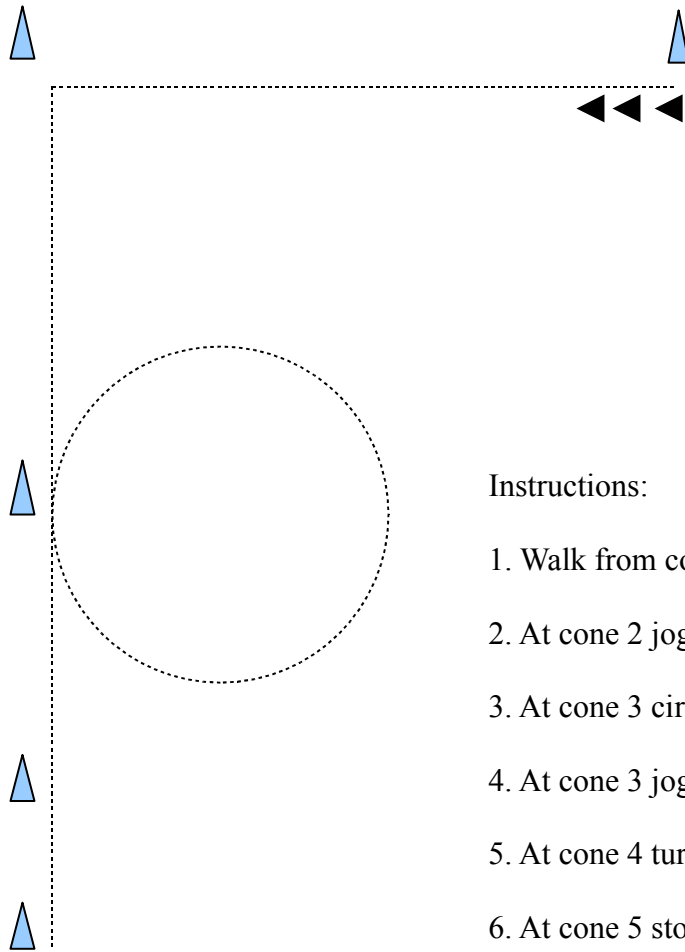

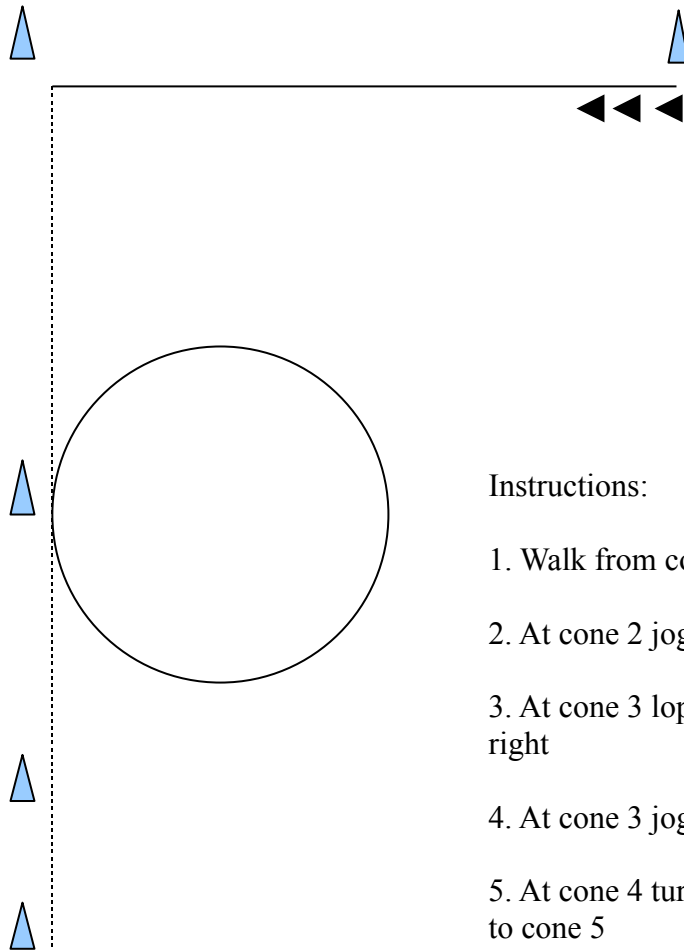
PRE-NOVICE HORSEMANSHIP



Instructions:

1. Walk from cone 1 to cone 2
2. At cone 2 jog to cone 3
3. At cone 3 circle to the right
4. At cone 3 jog to cone 4
5. At cone 4 turn right and jog to cone 5
6. At cone 5 stop and back a few steps

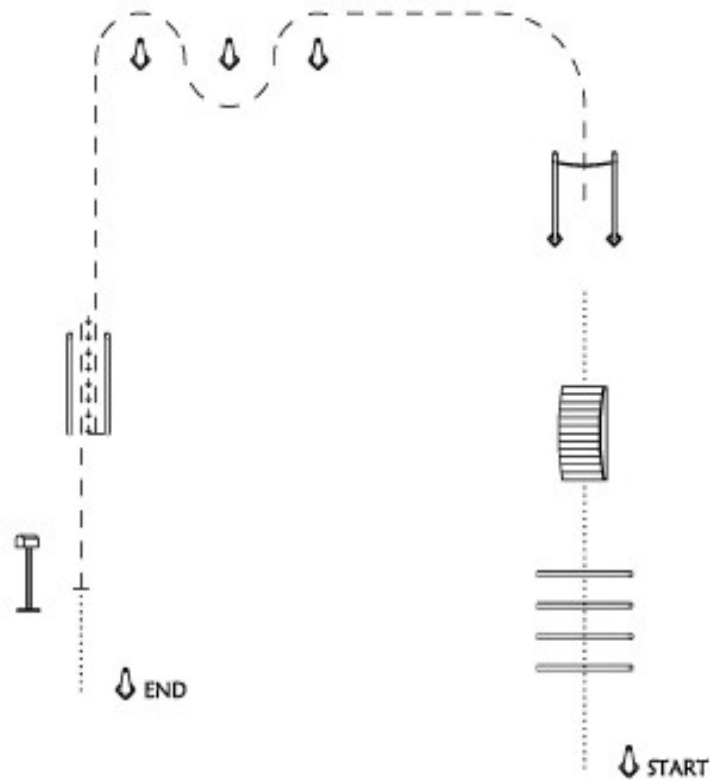
NOVICE HORSEMANSHIP



Instructions:

1. Walk from cone 1 to cone 2
2. At cone 2 jog to cone 3
3. At cone 3 lope right and circle to the right
4. At cone 3 jog to cone 4
5. At cone 4 turn right and and lope right to cone 5
6. At cone 5 stop and back a few steps

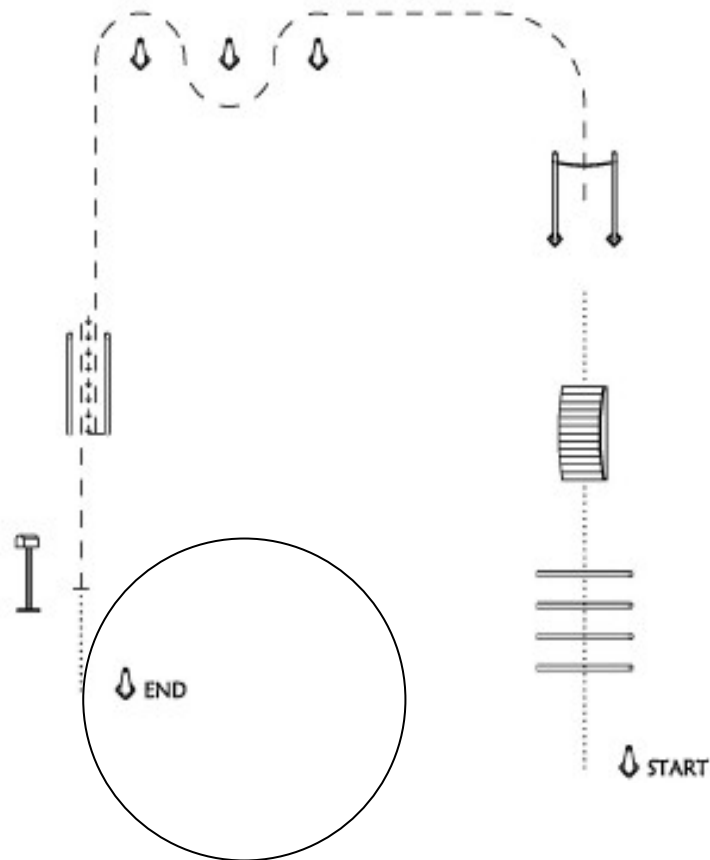
PRE-NOVICE TRAIL



Instructions

- Walk over the poles
- Walk over the bridge
- Walk to the gate
- Walk through open gate
- Jog a serpentine through the cones
- Jog between the back-through poles and stop
- Back up between the poles
- Jog to the mailbox, stop and show the mail
- Exit when excused by Judge

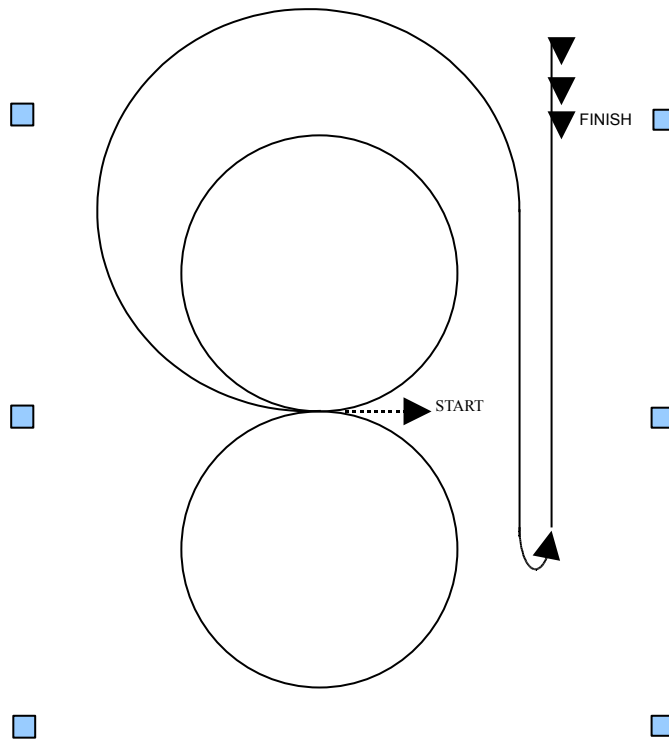
NOVICE TRAIL



Instructions

- Walk over the poles
- Walk over the bridge
- Walk to the gate
- Open and walk through left hand rope gate
- Jog a serpentine through the cones
- Jog between the back-through poles and stop
- Back up between the poles
- Jog to the mailbox, stop and show the mail
- Lope circle left lead around cone and stop through walk
- Exit when excused by Judge

GHS REINING PRE-NOVICE PATTERN 1



Horses may walk or trot to the center of the arena. Horses must walk or stop prior to starting pattern. Beginning at the center of the arena facing the left wall or fence.

11. Start at a jog and do a small circle to the right
12. Change rein and a small circle to the left
13. Continue round previous circle to right, do not close this circle. Jog up the right side of the arena, past the center marker, stop, hesitate, do a 180 ° turn on haunches to the left, at least 6 m from the wall or fence.
14. Continue back up right side of the arena, stop, hesitate. Back up a few steps

Rider must dismount and drop bridle to the designated judge.

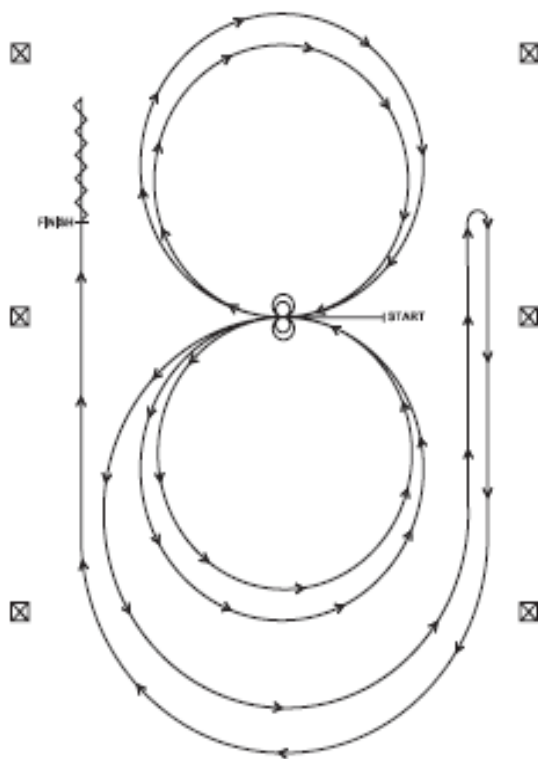

Horses may walk or trot to the center of the arena. Horses must walk or stop prior to starting the pattern. Beginning at the center of the arena facing the left wall or fence.

1. Beginning on the left lead, complete two circles to the left. Stop at the center of the arena. Hesitate.
2. Complete two spins to the left. Hesitate.
3. Beginning on the right lead complete two circles to the right. Stop at the center of the arena. Hesitate.
4. Complete two spins to the right. Hesitate.
5. Beginning on the left lead, go around the end of the arena, run down the right side of the arena past center marker, stop and roll back right.
6. Continue around the end of the arena to run down the left side of the arena past the center marker. Stop. Back up.

Rider must dismount and drop the bridle to the designated judge.
